INFRASTRUCTURE

The school is situated in a tranquil ambience. It has spacious and airy classrooms, digital classes, equipped science laboratories, well stocked Library, Mathematics and Computer Labs with internet facility.

The school has excellent infrastructure by way of multipurpose hall, auditorium, literary, eco, science and math Clubs and a play field which provide opportunities to all to excel in sports and co-curricular activities.

CURRICULUM

The school prepares the children for Central Board of Secondary Education, Delhi (CBSE).

Integral education is the core of the school curriculum. All scholastic and co-scholastic activities are focused on the formation of committed and competent students who are integrated and are willing to share in the building up of our country and our world. The medium of instruction is English, the language used internationally.

The course of studies offered and pursued at the school is as prescribed by the CBSE. The school curriculum for all consists of the given subjects: English, Hindi, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, computer and Oriya the state language.



EXAMINATION RULE

- An admit card will be provided to the students prior to half yearly and annual examinations which should be brought along for every examination. **Admit card will be issued only to those students who have cleared the fees up to date.**
- Unless the students score pass mark for all the subjects they won't be promoted to the next class.
- Those who fail twice are not allowed to continue in this school.
- 80% attendance is compulsory for promotion.
- Absence from tests/exams shall be entirely the responsibility of the parents. No re-tests/exams will be taken.

CO-SCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES

Co-Scholastic activities are of paramount importance in the development of the whole personality of every child. Interpersonal relational skills, tolerance, confidence, poise and reliability are some of the qualities developed through co-scholastic activities. Hence such activities are essential part of the school programme.

Children are encouraged to participate in co-curricular activities such as karate, music, art/craft, classical and western dance etc.

Inter House Activities and Inter School Competitions:

The school has an activity schedule for the whole year. These activities aim to develop physical, literary and artistic skills of the students. The school also participates in inter-school and inter-zone competitions which help the students to develop aesthetic appreciation and self-confidence.

Tours and Picnics: Arrangements are made for students to participate in various camps organized at

scenic places. Apart from these educational trips, picnics are also organized for students. These educational tours are to bring awareness among the students of our rich heritage and rapid transformation.

Competitions are also organized and conducted for parents such as sports, rangoli, drawing, painting, dance, singing etc. It gives opportunity for the parents to enhance their talents and self-respect.





GAMES AND SPORTS

- Regular games and physical training are compulsory for all students.
- To bring out sportsmanship and competitiveness, our teams participate in inter school, zonal, regional and national level competitions. Opportunities are given to the children to develop an all-round personality and become proficient in games and sports.



SCHOOL MAGAZINE

Our school magazine 'Spark' is published annually and is a useful record of school activities conducted throughout the academic session.



HOUSE SYSTEM

All the students of the School are divided into four Houses. Each House is looked after by teachers in charge. This concept of Houses provides opportunities for better organisation and healthy competitions.



GENERAL RULES

Student's Responsibility

- ✓ The School Diary must be brought to the school every day.
- ✓ Students should be regular and punctual in attending the classes.
- ✓ Students will not be sent home before time, except on a written request from the Parents/Guardians. The request may be granted by the principal for valid reasons only.
- ✓ Every child should bring healthy food such as chapatti, puri, idli or any other home-made item. Bringing chips, biscuits or any fast food items is not encouraged.
- ✓ The use of plastics in the school premises is prohibited as plastics are not eco-friendly.
- ✓ All students are expected to keep up the good name of the school by their good performance and behaviour.
- ✓ Any damage to the school property is to be made good by the student concerned or by the class responsible for it.
- ✓ When students leave the classroom the lights and fans must be switched off. Students are expected to maintain silence on the corridors. Running, shouting or talking loudly inside the school building during class hours is not allowed.
- ✓ Politeness and courtesy of speech are to be maintained. Spilling ink, littering papers, scribbling on school desks or walls, stealing or damaging other students' belongings or school property will be liable to punishment to the extent of a heavy fine to cover the damage, a suspension or even a dismissal.
- ✓ No leave of absence is granted except on prior written application from parents or guardians and only for valid reasons.



PARENTS' RESPONSIBILITY

- Parents are requested to read the Student's Diary and the time table regularly and send the books accordingly.
- They need to ensure that their child attends school neatly, both in person and uniform.
- They are requested to regularly check the child's performance in academic and curriculum activities.
- Children are not supposed to bring valuables to the School. The school accepts no responsibility whatsoever for loss of valuables brought to school.
- Parents are not permitted to give electronic items (Mobile, MP3 player, etc) to their ward. If found with children, these will be confiscated and will not be returned.
- Parents are not allowed to go to the class rooms for any reasons. They shall contact the Principal in case of any urgency.
- Parents are requested to ensure that their ward utilizes vacation period for studies and completing the home work.
- Parents are requested to send their wards back to school on due date after each vacation/break failing which the pupil will have to face serious consequences.
- A student suffering from contagious disease should not be sent to the school till the student is completely free from infection. A fitness certificate from the doctor should be submitted to the Principal when the student is sent to the school after recovery from such diseases.
- Regular Parent-Teacher meeting is organized during which parents are advised to interact with the teachers.
- The school should be notified in case of change in the address or contact number of the parents/guardians
- Student's performance, activities, home-work, absence will be intimated to the parents through Parents alarm.



DISCIPLINE

- The aim of St. Arnold's Convent School is to form disciplined pupils. The school reserves the right to expel any student on grounds of lack of progress in studies, immoral activity or contempt of authority.
- The school will inform the parents regarding inappropriate behaviour of the ward with suggestion for parental action and support. Parents are requested to co-operate with school in maintaining discipline and following the norms of the school.



SCHOOL FEES

Mode of payment:

The school fees for the academic year are payable in four instalments in the following months:

1st Installment	1st-30th April
2nd Installment	1st - 31st July
3rd Installment	1st- 31st October
4th Installment	3rd- 31st January

- Mode of payment through Online, Credit card, Debit card can be done in Axis bank.
- A fine of Rs. 50/- will be charged from the defaulters per installment.
- The fee paid is not refundable after the completion of admission formalities.
- You are free to make yearly or half yearly advance payment.
- All fees must be cleared before the main examinations.
- The school fees cover twelve calendar months. No reduction is made for holidays and broken periods.
- Students are liable to pay full fees as long as their names are officially on the rolls.

OTHER REGULATIONS

Girls having short hair must make a pony tail, those with very short hair must put a black/navy blue hair-band (elastic) and girls with long hair must make two plaits with black/navy blue hair band. Boys should have neatly cut short hair. All should strictly avoid streaking/colouring of hair, or stylish cuts and fringes. Nails must be short and clean. Use of Nail polish is strictly prohibited.
